


COMMERCIAL PILOT CERTIFICATE

The Commercial Pilot Certificate allows a pilot to accept Pay for transporting passengers or cargo (when complying with FAR PART 135 or 121.) The certificate is required for other pilot positions such as flight instruction, banner towing, and aerial photography. The certificate never expires. The flight training must include operations in an aircraft with retractable landing gear, flaps and a constant speed propeller (complex aircraft.) This training fine tunes piloting skills. Minimum age requirement is 18 years and the course, based on 2-3 sessions per week, is normally about two months.



THE FAA HAS SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

MINIMUM 250 HOURS – TOTAL FLIGHT TIME (MAX 50 HRS IN SIMULATOR)

- 100 HRS IN POWERED AIRCRAFT 50 HRS IN AIRPLANES
- 100 HRS PILOT IN COMMAND
 - o 50 HRS IN AIRPLANE
 - 50 HOURS CROSS COUNTRY OVER 50 NM
- 20 HRS TRAINING (DUAL GROUND & FLIGHT)
 - 10 HRS INSTRUMENT TRAINING (EST. COST ASSUMES IFR RATING COMPLETE)
 - 10 HRS FLIGHT INSTRUCTION (COMPLEX)
 - 100 NM NIGHT CROSS COUNTRY (2 HRS)
 - 100 NM DAY CROSS COUNTRY (2 HRS)
 - o 3 HRS PREPARATION FOR CHECK RIDE
- 10 HRS SOLO FLIGHT
 - ONE 300 NM FLIGHT THREE LDGS --AT LEAST 250 NM FROM DEPARTURE AIRPORT
 - 5 HRS NIGHT (10 T/O & LDGS)
